

WHEN DO FOOD REGULATIONS APPLY



- 21 CFR, Part 123.3 - Definitions

- **Fish** means fresh or saltwater finfish, crustaceans, other forms of aquatic animal life (including, but not limited to, alligator, frog, aquatic turtle, jellyfish, sea cucumber, and sea urchin and the roe of such animals) other than birds or mammals, and all mollusks, where such animal life is intended for human consumption.
- Processing Handling, storing, preparing, heading, eviscerating, shucking, freezing, changing into different market forms, manufacturing, preserving, packing, labeling, dockside unloading, or holding.



Direct to consumer sales

- Retail Food Establishment License
- Food Service Establishment License
- Mobile Food License
- Farmers Market Food Establishment License
- Temporary Food Establishment License

Wholesale sales

- Food Processing Plant & Food Warehouse License
- FDA Food Facility Registration
 - This is not a license and registration is free
 - There are some exemptionsplease contact the FDA for guidance on food facility registration
